- Holistic approach to address sustainability issues

- Equips individuals and communities with the **understanding**, **skills**, **values** and attitudes to engage in **transformative** action to shape green, low-emission and climate-resilient societies

GREENING CURRICULUM

From early childhood through adult education, work to ensure that all schools achieve green school accreditation, including teacher training and higher education institutions.

HERE'S HOW YOU CAN

Embrace a life-long learning approach that integrates climate education into school curricula, technical and vocational education, workplace skills development, teaching materials, pedagogy, and assessment.

Strengthen education systems to be climate-smart with adequate measures, and ensure teachers and policymakers are trained.

Countries and organizations are encouraged to join the Greening Education
Partnership, expressing their interest in at least one of the four action areas.

Engage communities by integrating climate education in life-long learning, in particular through community learning centres and learning cities.



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RECOMMENDATION 1

Emphasize the urgent need for collective action to address climate change through education.

RECOMMENDATION 2

Include a climate change education component in all development policies.

RECOMMENDATION 4

Support educational institutions to be green and climate-ready.

RECOMMENDATION 5

Embed climate change perspectives into green skills and vocational education programmes.

RECOMMENDATION 6

Empower teachers with comprehensive climate change education training and resources.

RECOMMENDATION 7

Engage with the youth to build a green future.

RECOMMENDATION 8

Incorporate local and traditional knowledge that supports low-carbon lifestyles in climate change education.

Promote partnerships to foster innovations in climate change education.
