The British Council's Climate Connection initiative embodies this ambition by bringing people together globally to address the challenges posed by climate change through culture, education and the English language.

In partnership with CBSE, the British Council has been instrumental in developing programmes and resources supporting institutional and systemic development across schools in India. This collaboration has yielded a wide array of educational tools and resources, drawing upon expertise from the UK and India. 


Using the power of football and creative teaching methods, the programme enables children to achieve success in everything from maths and English to teamwork and sports.

Competency-based Education Project - CBSE

The CBSE is spearheading a Competency-based Education Project aimed at enhancing schools' capabilities to deliver top-notch competency-focused lessons, specifically in science, mathematics, and English reading. This initiative operates within the secondary level (classes 6 to 10) in collaboration with the Central Board of Secondary Education.

Aligned with the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020), considered India's most significant educational reform in three decades, this project seeks to revolutionize assessment methodologies. Departing from the traditional summative assessment system that primarily tests memorization, the NEP 2020 advocates for a shift towards a more frequent, formative evaluation that emphasizes competency-based learning. The focus lies on nurturing students' learning and practical skills, encouraging critical thinking, analysis, and conceptual clarity. Additionally, it aims to guide school boards in adapting assessment patterns to meet the demands of 21st-century skills.
